USA Gymnastics is looking forward to bringing the largest USA Delegation ever to the World Gymnaestrada in Lausanne Switzerland in 2011! USAG presented it's first official delegation at a World Gymnaestrada in 1995 in Berlin Germany. Since Berlin, USAG has taken delegations to Goteborg Sweden in 1999, Lisbon Portugal in 2003 and Dornbirn Austria in 2007. The Gymnaestrada is an incredible opportunity for performers of all ages and ability levels as well as their family and friends. It's a once in a lifetime opportunity and we hope you will join in the experience.

We are in the early stages of planning. The USA Gymnastics For All Committee and National Travel Systems Representatives have already made two site visits to Lausanne to assist with the preparations. Lausanne is a beautiful city filled with the spirit of sport and will serve as a wonderful host as an expected 25,000 participants from over 50 countries come together to take part in the World Gymnaestrada July 10-16, 2009.

For the first time, USA Gymnastics and National Travel Systems will offer a "USA Fan Package" in addition to the Participant Package. This will give a wider opportunity for family and friends to join the USA Delegation. More details regarding pricing and package details will be available soon.

## LAUSANNE

Switzerland, a small country nestled in the heart of Europe, is known for its mountains, its watches, its cheese and chocolate.

Gymnastics? Is also a real tradition in Switzerland!

Almost 400,000 people are members of the Swiss Gymnastics Federation (FSG), which makes it the biggest polysports association in the country.

Many of its gymnasts participate enthusiastically at the Gymnaestrada.

Today it has the honour of hosting this event for the first time in its French-speaking region, specifically in Lausanne, a city that lives for sport and gymnastics. You can judge for yourselves!

Recognised as the Olympic Capital, Lausanne is proud to host the headquarters of the International Olympic Committee since 1915.

Also as administrative capital of world sport, Lausanne hosts around twenty of the international sporting federations, including the European Gymnastics Union (UEG) and quite recently The International Gymnastics Federation (FIG), as well as many institutions associated with sport, such as the Court of Arbitration for Sport, the World Anti-doping Agency and the International House of Sport.

Lausanne has built a solid reputation as organizer of sporting events.

As a result, there have been no less than twenty European or World championships organised here between 1988 and 2008:

We can mention among others:

- In 1990 : Men's Artistic Gymnastics European Championships
- In 1997 : Artistic Gymnastics World Championships
- In 2008 : Men's Artistic Gymnastics European Championships

In addition, the repeated annual success of the "Lausanne 20 km", "Lausanne Bicycle Day", and the "International Beach Volley Tournament" are proof of the city's professionalism in the organisation of large scale sporting occasions.





#### It is a city open to the world and offers many amusements

Overlooking the Lake of Geneva, opposite the Alps, set among the vineyards of the areas of la Côte and Lavaux, Lausanne is a charming city to visit. Recognised as one of Europe's greenest cities, thanks to its many parks, gardens and woodlands, it inspires a feeling of calm and peace in those who visit and live there.

In a more than privileged situation, this small metropolis of human dimensions offers all the advantages of a big city. With a population of 125,000 inhabitants, at the heart of an agglomeration of 25,000, Lausanne is Switzerland's fifth largest city.

A town with a great tradition as a host, it counts some 5,000 hotel beds of all categories and a top rate services infrastructure (banks, insurance companies, international organizations), a vast choice of boutiques and shops, large restaurants and small friendly bistros, a university, a technical college, professional colleges, an opera, theatres, some twenty museums, youth hostels, discotheques, over 300 clubs and sporting associations and a programme of cultural and recreational events which do not leave a free moment to anyone who likes to go out...

In summary, a city of leisure, education, culture, business, conferences and treatment, where everyone can do what he/she wants, according to his/her tastes and budget.

Lausanne also constitutes an idyllic home base for visiting Switzerland's most famous tourist spots, such as Montreux, Chillon Castle, the Matterhorn or even Lucern!
